


With support from North Highlands Initiative, Brora Development Trust were able to invite experienced radio presenter and technician, Joshua Taylor to provide technical support. Joshua, Assistant Studio Manager at Wester Ross Radio, has worked closely with our team to configure equipment, install software, and ensure the technical foundations of the station are sound.

The young people worked hard to research, prepare and deliver a presentation, which highlights the benefits of Brora Development Trust's Healthy Holiday project and Brora Youth Room, youth work initiative.

During the finals, groups in S3 at Golspie High School, shared presentations to showcase their chosen charity's work. The winning group, who include Brora Youth Room members, have secured £3,000 in prize money for Brora Development Trust. This money will be shared between the Brora Youth Room initiative for trips and special events and the Healthy Holiday project: which makes meal starter kits available to families of young people enrolled in Early Years education, primary and secondary schools, living in Brora, for school holidays.

Since it was introduced to Scotland in 2008 by The Wood Foundation, the Youth and Philanthropy Initiative has engaged more than 390,000 young people who have taken responsibility for £8.5m of charitable giving. YPI is the biggest independent initiative being delivered in Scottish education. Each school is responsible for directing a grant of £3,000 to a local charity championed by its students through a unique programme of teamwork, research, and competition.
